INTRODUCTION

This policy explains how, and why we use your personal data, to ensure you remain informed and in control of your information.

We are committed to protecting your privacy and security.

This Privacy Policy applies to anyone that Cumbrian Girls Can comes into contact with.

OPT-IN

Cumbrian Girls Can asks supporters to “opt-in” to remain on our contact list for future communications. This means you’ll have the choice as to whether you want to receive future communications from us, and to provide consent to contact you using contact details you have provided.

You can decide not to receive communications or change how we contact you at any time.

OPT-OUT

WHAT WILL WE DO WITH YOUR DETAILS

We will **never** sell your personal data. We only put others/ other organisations we work with in touch with you if you have asked us to, or given us permission. We may occasionally partner with other organisations, for instance to jointly organise an event. If you register to attend an event being jointly organised by us and another organisation we may need to share your information with them. We will only share information when necessary and for the purposes that you have provided the data to us.

WHAT INFORMATION WE COLLECT

Personal data you provide

We collect data you provide to us in the course of our usual operations. This includes information you give when communicating with us. For example personal details e.g name, email, district you live in, telephone etc when you attend an event or respond to a request for feedback.

We may collect information from social media where you have given us permission to do so.

Sensitive personal data

We do not normally collect or store sensitive personal data (such as information relating to health, beliefs or political affiliation) about supporters and members. However, there are some situations where this will occur (e.g. if you volunteer or work with us or if you have an accident at one of events). If this does occur, we'll take extra care to ensure your privacy rights are protected.

Volunteer

If you are a volunteer then we may collect extra information about you (e.g. references, criminal records checks, details of emergency contacts, medical conditions etc.). This information will be retained for legal reasons, to protect us and you (including in the event of an insurance or legal claim) and for safeguarding purposes.

Anonymised data

We may aggregate and anonymise personal data so that it can no longer be linked to any particular person. This information can be used for a variety of purposes, such as identify trends or patterns within our community. This information helps inform our actions and improve what we do.

Parental permission:

If your child is under 18 then we'll need permission from you as their parent or guardian for them to be included in a photograph, or to be part of a direct social media post. This involves filling in a short form. We may however share posts from other sources, trusting that consent has been given. If this is not the case please contact us immediately and we will remove the post from our feed.

We take great care to protect and respect the rights of individuals in relation to their personal data, especially in the case of children. If your child is under 18, we'll only use his or her personal data with your consent.

STORING INFORMATION

Under the General data protection regulations, we are required to make sure that we use and store information for so long as it is required for the purposes it was collected for. How long information is stored depends on the information in question, and what it is being used for.

We regularly review what information we hold and delete what is no longer required.
